DOCUMENTING SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY AND

This is to remind staff that FYI 18-15, states that Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity and Expression (SOGIE) should be documented, if consent is given, in the CWS/CMS Client Notebook ID page in the Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, and Gender Expression fields. Staff must follow the

EXPRESSION (SOGIE) DATA INTO CWS/CMS

Additionally, All County Letter No.19-20, provides updated guidance and instructions for SOGIE documentation in CWS/CMS.

The following are important reminders for staff when collecting and documenting SOGIE information:

- The sharing of SOGIE information by the minor/Non-Minor Dependent(NMD) is voluntary and the minor/NMD may decline to disclose any of their SOGIE information.
- If consent is given by the minor/NMD, document in CWS/CMS what the minor/NMD discloses and update the information as changes are reported by the minor/NMD.
 - Subjective opinions or assumptions on the minor/NMD's SOGIE should neither be made nor documented in CWS/CMS.
- There is no right or wrong age to ask a minor/NMD about their sexual orientation and gender identity and expression.
- Staff should engage minors/NMDs who are developmentally and congnitively capable of understanding and discussing gender, in an age-appropriate discussion of their preferred gender expression and the gender with which they identify.
- A minor/NMD's SOGIE is not static and may change during the duration of a case.
- Per WIC 827, A minor/NMD's SOGIE is not to be disclosed to other individuals or agencies, without the minor/NMD's permission.
- Staff must refer to the glossary of SOGIE data frame terms to ensure consistent usage and unified understanding of SOGIE terms.
