NITROUS OXIDE (NOS) TESTING

The purpose of this FYI is to provide staff with information regarding Nitrous Oxide (NOS) testing. Nitrous Oxide is not a part of the standard panel of substances for testing and requires the following:

- Specialized Testing
- A court order

A blood test is the primary mode of testing for Nitrous Oxide. <u>Instructions</u> on how to request Nitrous Oxide testing via a <u>specialized testing referral</u> can be located on the Drug and Alcohol Testing Services website, "<u>Forms</u>" section.

If blood testing for Nitrous Oxide is requested by the court, please see the <u>attached document</u> for additional information regarding this type of testing.

Nitrous Oxide only has a detectable half-life in blood of approximately five (5) to fifteen (15) minutes. This can be longer if an individual is a chronic user of Nitrous Oxide, but in general, Nitrous Oxide is only detectable for a very short time.

Physiological factors affect the way our bodies metabolize drugs, including Nitrous Oxide. Some of these factors are:

- Age
- Physical Activity
- · Frequency and intensity of use

Only three (3) sites offer Nitrous Oxide testing:

- Allmed of El Monte
- Catalina Island Medical Center in Avalon
- Clinica Medica General in Los Angeles

This is subject to change depending on our testing vendor, however. Please consult with a Drug Testing Program manager at: Specializeddrugtesting@dcfs.lacounty.gov prior to referring a client to test for Nitrous Oxide.

The cost per Nitrous Oxide test \$556 per test (the cost of a standard urine test is \$38).
